

Energizing Education students vary from grades K-2, and we saw very positive results in each class, most notably the first-grade. 100%

of first-graders in Energizing Education at Frost Elementary progressed at least one full fluency level in their reading. Coming into the school year, these students were at risk of falling behind, but those children are now reading alongside their peers and on track for success.

AVOIDING THE SUMMER SLIDE!

Understanding the importance of summer reading

Summer is usually a joyous time for young children. School is out of session, students can sleep in, and reading is often the last thing on their minds. While this may mean more fun for your child, there is a downside to summer vacation which many parents are aware of.

It is called the "summer slide", and it refers to the effects that sitting idle for three months has on most young students. Vacation trips and summer excitement can lead to reading being put on the back burner, which inhibits the progress students make during the school year. Experts agree that children who read during the summer gain reading skills, while those who do not often slide backward.
